I hope you don't mind me sending this letter but knowing of your interest in teaching music I thought you might like to learn of a range of books I've found whilst surfing the Internet. The books, known as 'Music Fun', are a series of theory workbooks aimed principally at young children, from those just beginning their musical career to those at grade three (ABRSM level). The books are written in a child friendly way and make great use of puzzles and games to get the theory across in a fun but structured way.

In addition the company, Sounds Write, publishes a weekly practice notebook and a helpful guide for parents of pupils just starting out. This latter book 'My child won't practise!' looks very useful if the parents aren't musically inclined as it provides them with a wide range of ideas for stimulating and encouraging their son or daughter to persevere with practice — so essential between lessons you'll agree — and develop their general musical awareness.

Also, if you're looking for ideas for developing your pupil's musicianship skills they publish a book entitled 'Can we do another?' — might be worth taking a look at.
